Did You Know?

Recycled plastic planks are now used for park benches and picnic tables in and around the arena, reducing maintenance and replacement costs.

The Town of Black Diamond has a tree planting program which has planted over 90 trees since its start up in 2006. June 8, 2018 six new trees were added around the town.

In the last 14 years the Oilfields Regional Arena has conserved 4,429,646 gallons of water and saved \$27,116.21 through various water conservation projects.
